VIRGINIA 6 A.M. TRAFFIC CONDITION UPDATE

FAIRFAX, Va. – Three Virginia Metro Station parking lots are now full and closed to incoming traffic. Motorists are strongly encouraged to seek out designated Park and Ride lots along Interstates 95, 495, and 66 for free bus service to the Metro stations.

Metro Station Parking Lot Closures:

- Van Dorn Metro Station
- Franconia-Springfield Metro Station

Though the parking lots are closed to incoming traffic, the free transit bus service from designated Park and Ride lots will still be serving these Metro stations. Park and Ride lots are still open and available to incoming traffic. Park and Ride lots are free. In Maryland, the Greenbelt, New Carrollton and Branch Avenue Metro Station parking lots are full.

Virginia traffic is steadily increasing throughout the Northern and Central regions. As of 6 a.m., Virginia State Police have no reported traffic crashes along Interstates 495 and 66. Along I-95 northbound from Richmond to Washington, D.C., one minor traffic has been reported. Most calls for service are dealing with disabled vehicles.

Congestion is building at the Springfield Interchange and at the I-66/I-495 interchange. Traffic delays are being experienced on I-95 and I-66 near Metro Station exits.
